John Addison has suggested two runs on Saturday 23rd:

1) South from Fort Augustus down A82 to B8004 to Corpach then A380 to Mallaig (Road to the Isles). Take ferry to Armadale in Skye (£12:15 for bike and £4.75 per person). Ferry takes about 30 minutes. Follow A87 through Kyle of Lochalsh back to Invermoriston.

John suggests leaving the campsite @ 9:30 with a lunch stop at Mallaig or Kyle of Lochalsh (ferry @ 12:15, 13:45). Returning to Fort Augustus late afternoon for a meal and get together.

2) As above to Mallaig but return round Moidart and Sunart via A861 to Corran ferry then A82 north to Fort Augustus via Fort William.

If it is decided to go on run 1) and cannot get on the ferry then abort to route 2.

Both runs will be about 150 miles and both are on excellent roads so promise to be an excellent day out.

Closing this special Cairn O Mount edition of the Newsletter leaves me to say thank you to all club members who took the time to enter and to the previously mentioned organisers of the event who collectively delivered an excellent day out.

I look forward to next year's Cairn O Mount, exact dates to be confirmed at the clubs annual general meeting.
